Do Our Cricketers Need Better Protection?

A long-term study published online by the <u>Medical Journal of Australia</u> undertook a historical review of direct trauma-related deaths in Australian cricket, both organised and informal.


The first of its kind, it looked at cases of players whose deaths were "directly related to participation in cricket", ranging from the backyard to first-class level.

The authors identified 174 fatalities in Australia from 1858 to 2016, including 83 in organised matches and 91 in "informal settings". However concluded that there appears to have been a substantial decline in the number of cricket-related deaths in recent years.

It is likely that the introduction of helmets for batsmen and close-in fielders has reduced the incidence of deaths in cricket, and almost eliminated deaths from blows to the head.

What Is The Diagnosis?

This image taken from <u>UpToDate</u> is a MRI of the brain, which demonstrates abnormal enhancement of the left optic nerve (arrow), consistent with optic neuritis.

Optic neuritis is an inflammatory, demyelinating condition that causes acute, usually monocular, visual loss. It is highly associated with multiple sclerosis (MS). Optic neuritis is the presenting feature of MS in 15 to 20 percent of patients and occurs in 50 percent at some time during the course of their illness.
