By describing what is known about how nurses experience resuscitations through the process of this integrative review, we can better understand the resuscitative context nurses work within and identify the conditions that support or hamper their delivery of safe and effective resuscitative care.

Despite more than 25 years of research establishing the antidepressant efficacy of repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation, there remains uncertainty about the depth and breadth of this evidence base.

Confusion remains as to where repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation fits in the therapeutic armamentarium in the management of patients with mood disorders.
