A recent Narrative Review published in the <u>Medical Journal of Australia (MJA)</u> identified mammalian meat allergy and tick anaphylaxis as most serious tickinduced allergies. The avoidance of tick bites is fundamental to preventing these severe reactions. Australian clinicians published the first cases of tick anaphylaxis and discovered the association between tick bites and the development of mammalian meat allergy.

Author Dr, Sheryl A van Nunen, Senior Staff Specialist at Royal North Shore Hospital Sydney, explains that mammalian meat allergy and tick anaphylaxis present quite differently. The eminent role of cofactors in triggering episodes of mammalian meat allergy is what can make the diagnosis complex. Multiple cofactors, e.g. alcohol, exercise, spices, cooking method, menstrual cycyle and others, affect the severity of the reaction and can make the diagnosis more difficult.

Answer: Pomegranate is not safe as it may increase warfarin plasma concentrations and increase the risk of bleeding!
